**Show Rules and Important Dates**

1. Must be a TAG member in good standing – Dues must have been paid by December 31, 1999.  
Check with Treasurer Barbie Mathis if you're not sure: 996-3601.
2. All art work must be original and not have been entered in any TAG show previously.  
No nudes will be accepted.
3. Members may enter ONE piece of art in any media.
4. There is a \$5.00 entrance fee.
5. Two dimensional art work must be framed (wood or metal) and be wired for hanging.  
Use heavy duty wire for large/heavy pieces. (Please, no sawtooth hooks.)
6. Size limitations of framed work: outside measurements must not exceed 72" for two sides (height plus width). 3-dimensional work should have its own base.
7. All work will be offered for sale, unless marked NFS (not for sale).  
CITY ART will handle all sales.  
There will be a total of 30% commission charged:  
CITY ART receives a 20% commission  
TAG receives a 10% commission
