Show Rules

1. Must be a TAG member in good standing (dues paid by Dec. 31, 2000). Check with Treasurer, Harvey Burnette if you are not sure: 254-3593.
2. All artwork must be original and not have been entered in any TAG show previously. No nudes will be accepted.
3. Members may enter ONE piece of art in any media.
4. There is a \$5.00 entry fee.
5. Two dimensional artwork must be framed (wood or metal) and be wired for hanging. Use heavy duty wire for large/heavy pieces. Please, no sawtooth hooks!
6. Size limitation of framed work: ~~outside~~ measurements must not exceed 72" for two sides (height plus width). 3-dimensional work should have its own base.
7. All work will be offered for sale, unless marked NFS (not for sale). CITY ART GALLERY will handle all sales. Artwork must remain on display at CITY ART for entire length of show (until April 16), no exceptions.
There will be a total of 30% commission charged on sales at show:
CITY ART receives a 20% commission
TAG receives a 10% commission.
